You can even access the Internet through Fife College's Teleflex facilities.

You can gain qualifications through Glenrothes College in computing, with a tutor available to support you, along with experienced and dedicated learning staff. All without going to College! You choose when you want to study to fit in with your family commitments, at a pace to suit your own needs.

All of these services are free—all you have to do is come along and speak to one of the staff who will offer guidance and advice on packs, use of computers or offer course and career advice.

Barnardos Kirkcaldy Family Support Project

The Project is an initiative of Fife Council and Barnardos. In the development of the Project Kirkcaldy Under 8's Forum were helpful in organising a consultation seminar with local groups and parents.

In August 1998 I came into post as Project Leader, two full-time and one part-time Project workers will be joining the Project in February 1999. The Project is temporarily based in the centre of Kirkcaldy, but should be moving to permanent premises in the Spring.

The Project will be developing a service

for families living in the Kirkcaldy Social Work District ie Kirkcaldy town, Cardenden, Burntisland, Kinghorn and Auchtertool. The main services the Project will provide are:

1 Assessment of children and families

The Project will undertake assessments where significant decisions have to be made about a child's circumstances. This will involve assessment of parenting abilities, child development, attachments, the level of risks and the potential for change. It will also involve identifying the resources a family will need to support any decision and working with the family and appropriate agencies in developing these.

2 Intensive support to families in the local community

The service will work with families both within their family homes and when appropriate within the Project (when permanent premises are identified), offering emotional and practical crisis support, including programmes for managing behaviour and building relationships between parents and children through play. This work will be in conjunction with other community resources, to help establish parental confidence and build supports within a family's own community.

3 Parent education and groupwork

The Project will be involved in developing parent education in the local area, using both group and individual approaches with families. Within this part of the service the Project will aim to work closely with existing services to facilitate local groups and help to establish traditional supports such as parent and toddler groups. Also to deliver structured parent education groups.

Referrals can be made to the Project by parents, social workers, health visitors, nurseries and other local groups. It is planned that the Project will begin taking referrals in March 1999.

On behalf of the Project I look forward to continuing our involvement with Kirkcaldy Under 8's Forum and having the opportunity to meet with parents and other local groups that it provides.

The facility will also be closely monitored.

Although this project is in the early stages of development it is hoped that suitable groups will be able access the facility early in 1999.
